The 15th Annual For the Love of An Angel Reverse Raffle and Silent Auction was held Saturday, February 9, 2013 at St. George Fellowship Center. Over 100 guests were welcomed, and the Angel Families present were introduced.

All enjoyed a delicious dinner catered by TLC Catering. Burt Keiper our MC began the Reverse Raffle at 8 p.m. with the first number drawn and that recipient receiving a night at the Sheraton's Suites Akron/Cuyahoga Falls. Gift cards and certificates to various restaurants and places of businesses were given out to every 6th number drawn as the Reverse Raffle moved along to the last five numbers remaining. The five winners

did a surprisingly special split and went home richer and very happy.

Along with the almost 80 Silent Auction items, including trips to our state capital, spa and beauty packages, jewelry, Lenox items, four tickets to both Cedar Point and Great Wolf Lodge and much more, the evening presented itself with the excitement of the Goodyear Blimp Ride for Two as a Live Auction item. Many participated in the bidding for this rare and special opportunity. The bidding ended with a recently retired grandpa of an angel having the top bid at \$1100.

Balloons provided another source of excitement. They were \$10 each and over half of the balloons pro-

vided an opportunity to receive a gift certificate valued at \$15 or more. One balloon provided one lucky purchaser with \$100 cash.

As this year's Raffle comes to an end and we close the books on another successful evening, we would like to express our appreciation to our guests and our many donors. We are thrilled to have raised over \$22,900 and to have profited approximately \$17,000 from this annual event.
